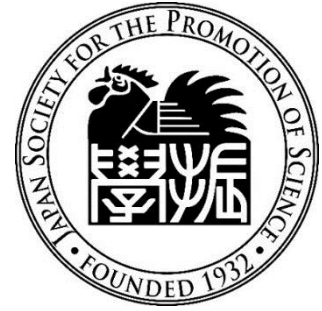


# Introduction of Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS)



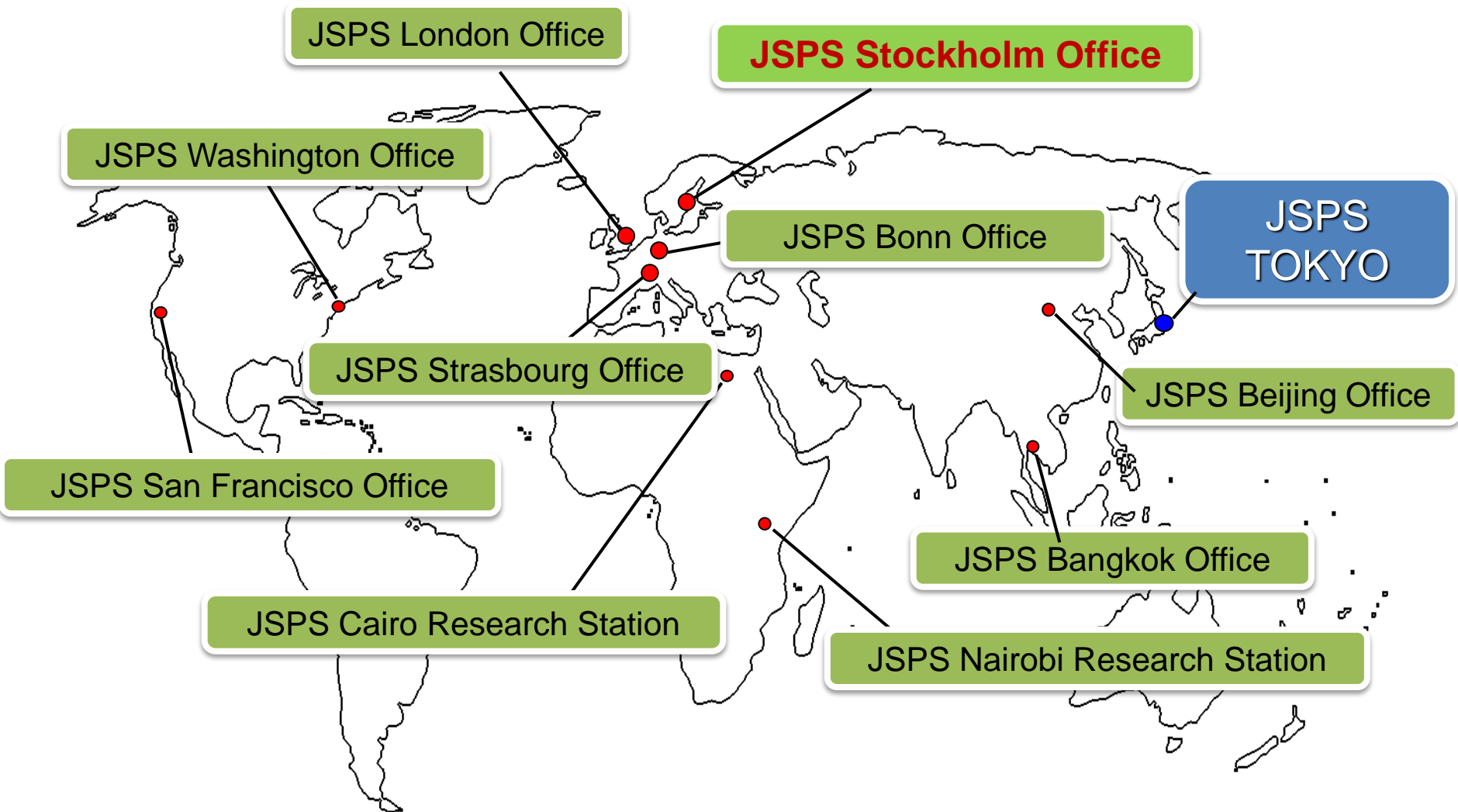
**JSPS was established in 1932 through an endowment by Emperor Showa.**

**Now JSPS is Japan's Core Research Funding Agency supporting the advancement of scientific research in all fields mainly by annual subsidies from the Japanese Government.**

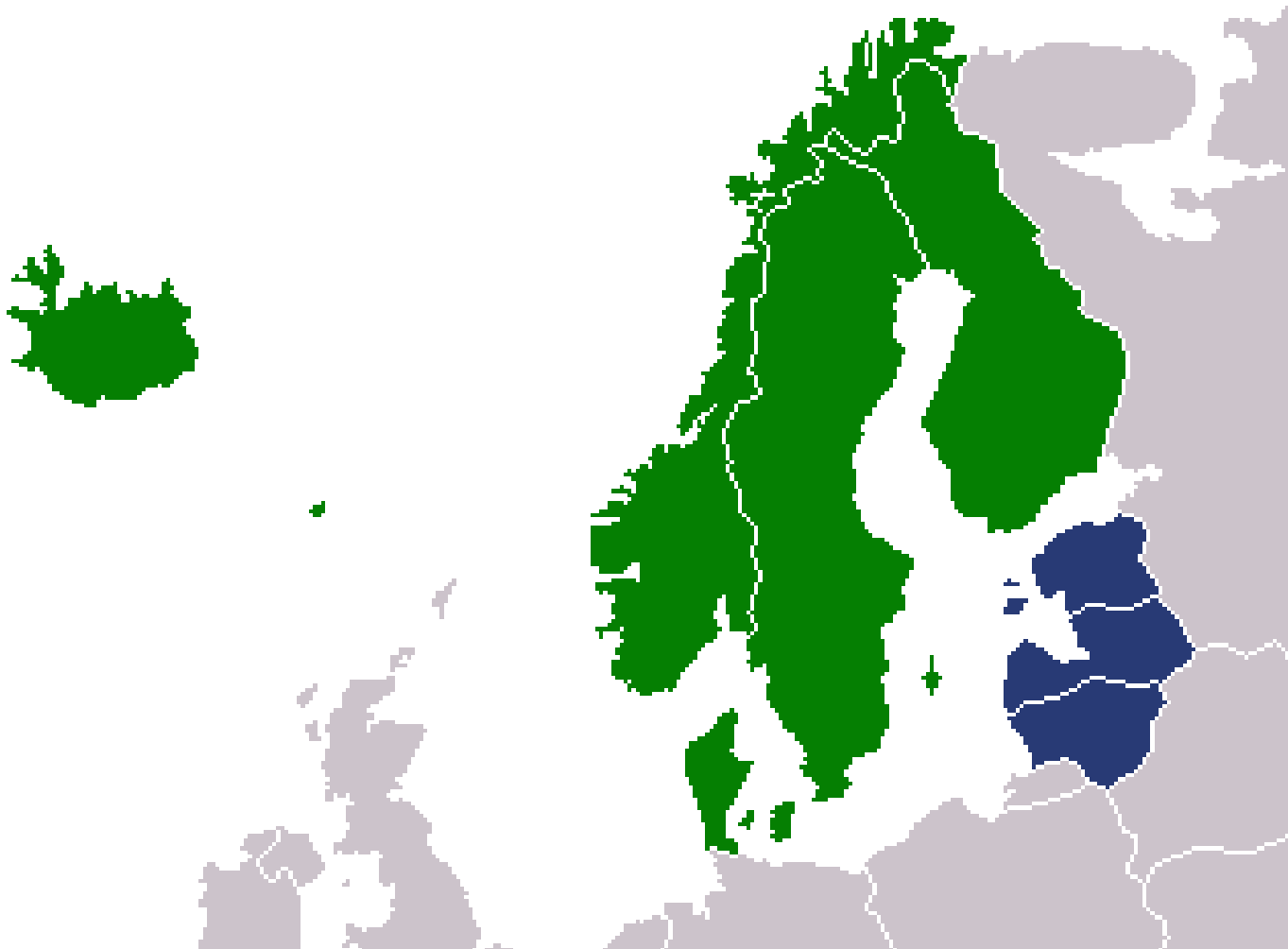
- **JSPS** supports *curiosity-driven* researches in natural/social sciences, engineering and humanities. In principle, no priority field.
- **JSPS funds**
  - Grant to research projects: Grant-in-Aid:  
(Total, *ca. 1.1 billion € /70,000 projects/year*)
    - For researchers at Japanese Institutions, regardless of their nationality.
  - Fellowships: *ca. 6,000* Japanese pre-/post-docs.
  - International collaborations: Bi- & multi-lateral programs  
Mobility facilitation by international programs (per year):  
*ca. 10,000 researchers* from pre-docs to professors  
(e.g., Number of Researchers; Sweden → Japan, 62, Japan → Sweden 81/FY2016)

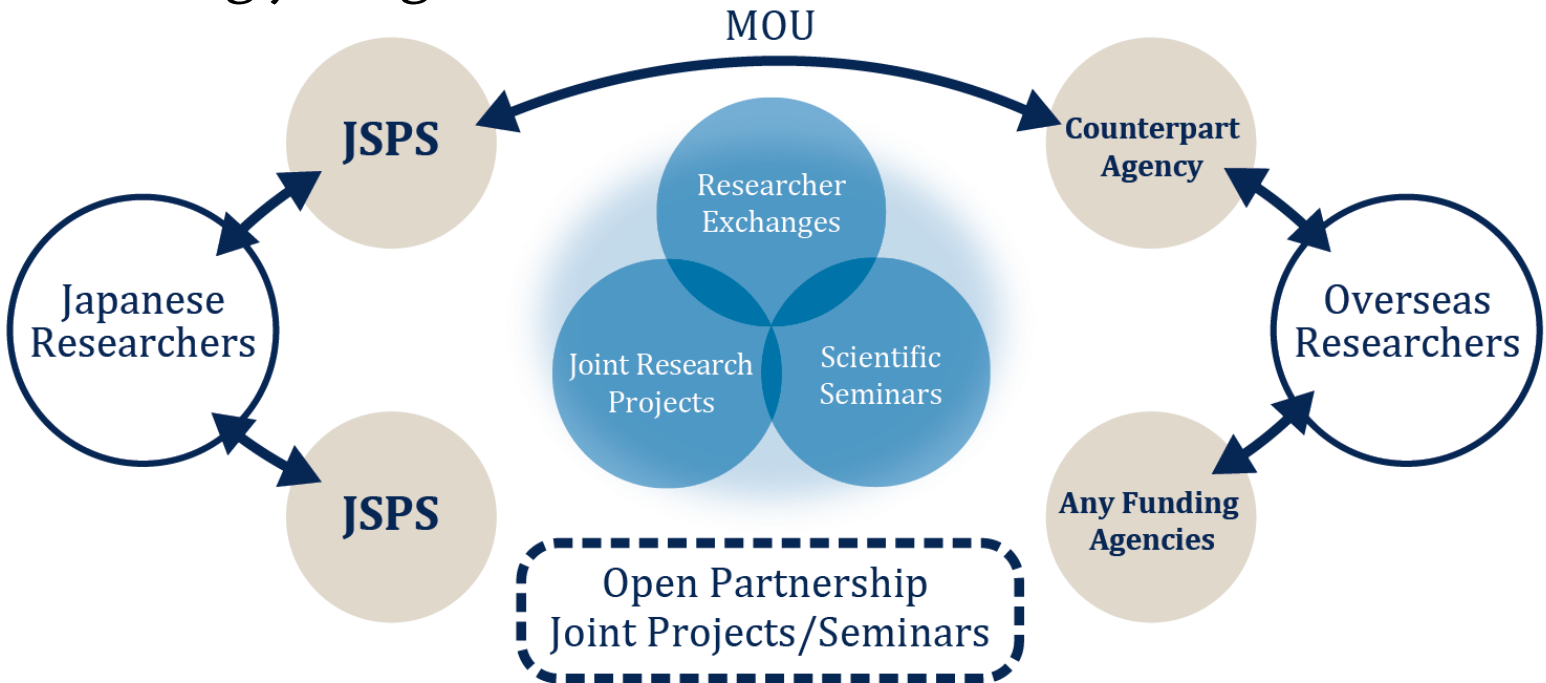

# JSPS International Programs

## (2) Bilateral Programs (up to 3 years)

The aim of these programs is to form sustained networks which have evolved from individual scientist exchanges including young scientists.

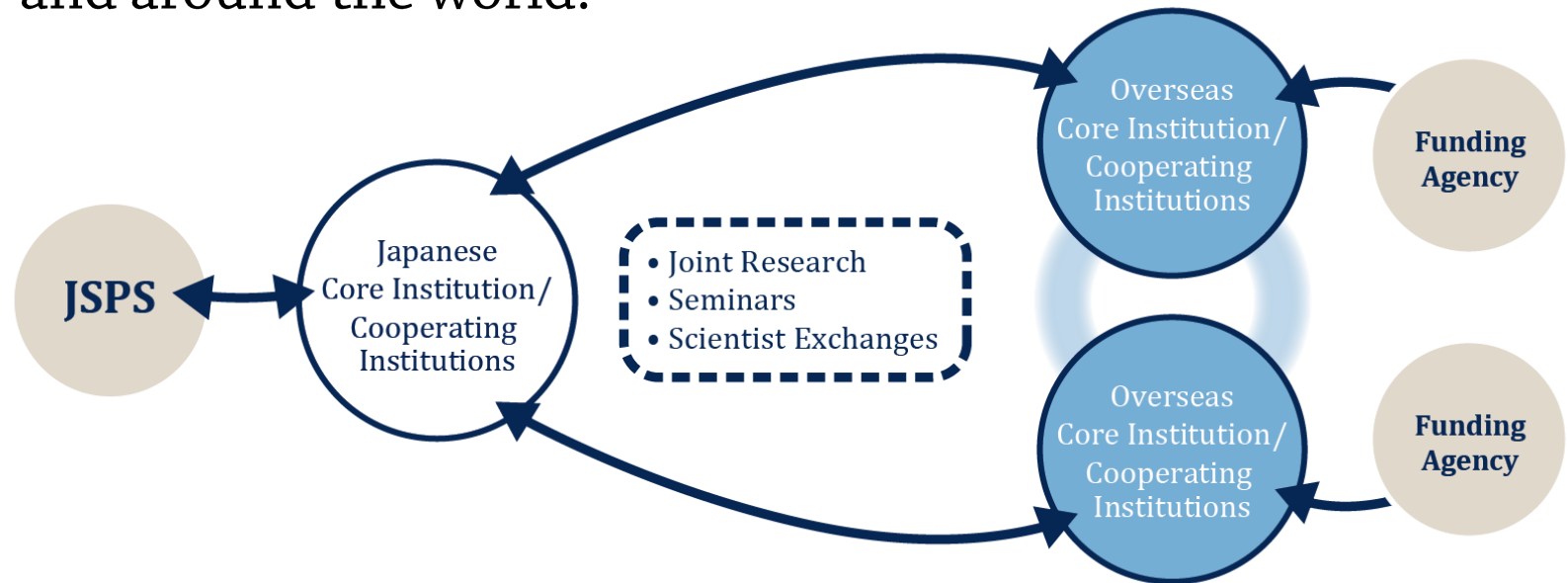


**Currently 8 programs are running between Japan and Sweden;** e.g., between Dr. K. Takeuchi in Univ. of Tokyo and Dr. T. Elmqvist in Stockholm Univ. on “Urban Sustainability and Resilience Initiative for liable and healthy cities” from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2020.

# JSPS International Programs

## (3) Core-to-Core Program (up to 5 years)

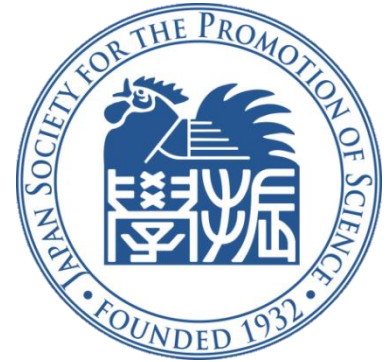
This program is designed to create world-class research hubs in cutting-edge research fields and establish sustainable collaborative relations among research institutions in Japan and around the world.



**Currently 3 programs are running between Japanese and Swedish cores;** e.g., Univ. Tokyo (Japanese core) – KTH (Swedish core) on “Nanoscale electron- photon interactions via energy dissipation and fluctuation” from 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2019
